Message from the Principal

Dear Parents and Caregivers

We have definitely been experiencing some winter weather since school returned this term. It is terrific to see how the children are managing themselves during recess and lunch when the rain arrives. They are seeking cover and taking on responsibility for remaining dry. As much as possible we strive to implement the wet weather policy prior to break times, however it is not always possible to predict the weather's action.

Whilst I can complement the students on their wet weather behaviour, unfortunately the same cannot be said in relation to a few parents who see the rain as an excuse to use the front and back staff car parks as drop off points for their children because 'I'm not parking I'm just dropping off my child!' This is highly dangerous and inconsiderate behaviour!! In addition, if all parents used the Kiss and Drive area correctly the traffic flow around the school would be greatly improved. Concerns in relation to this area have been reported by several parents to the Wanneroo Shire.

At the last P&C meeting we discussed forward planning for 2019, in particular in relation to implementing 'Bring Your Own Device' at the Year 4 level. Mr Gould has been undertaking a raft of research in relation to this, inclusive of visits to schools that have already implemented this process, such as Bertram Primary and Landsdale Primary. He is hosting an information evening on Thursday, 30 August. Parents are encouraged to 'save this date' and come along to find out more about the project.

Parents visiting the office may have noted an increasing display of plastic objects, inclusive of a pug with only two feet, a lovely replica of Rigby, a fidget spinner and a tyrannosaurus head. These are the results of Mr Gould 'playing' with the two 3D printers that the school now has. As we all know, we learn best by 'having a go' and that is what is happening. We have learned that some filaments are better than other filaments for printing specific shapes, hence the pug with only two feet. We have also learnt that printing on a finer setting results in a stronger object. Earlier this year Mr Gould applied for our school to be part of the Western Power Circuit Breakers project. One hundred and sixty schools applied for involvement and twenty

Uniform shop Opening times Wed 2.15 - 3.00 Fri 8.15 - 9.00 were selected to participate, with Mindarie being one of the successful schools. The project involves students investigating how the Western Power grid works. As part of the project the students in Year 5 will be working with an engineer from Western Power. They will be working through a series of six lessons. This is an extremely innovative program based on the following Western Power philosophy:

'Circuit Breakers are thinkers, makers and innovators. Circuit Breakers are students who look differently at the world around them, and find ways to bring their ideas to life. Circuit Breakers is our exciting engineering outreach program for primary school students in years 4 to 6. This STEM program for primary schools situated within our network, will help develop knowledge and skills with a focus on electrical engineering using 3D printers.'

A quick internet search using the following statement 'Western Power Circuit Breakers project for schools' will provide further information about the project. A big plus for our school is that at the end of the project we get to keep the two 3D printers!!

Still on the IT focus, today a couple of teams of Year 5 and 6 students participated in the Scitech annual robotics challenge in the area of dancing robots. The students have been working on building and then coding their robots to dance to a set piece of music. This has been an after school activity coordinated by the Year 6 teachers. It has been wonderful to see the growth in the student's skills in this area. We wish them every success in their endeavours.

Our school is one of three schools participating in the 'Telstra Digital Futures' project. You may have noticed the huge banner on the Early Childhood fence and the other banner in the office publicising this project. Digital Futures is Telstra's way of supporting youth to embrace the creative power of technology. You can support the school by visiting the Telstra shop at Ocean Keys, collecting a token and dropping it into the Mindarie Primary School box. Don't be deceived by the number of tokens in the box, they do need to empty it regularly. Voting runs until 19 August 2018 and you can vote more than once, children can also vote. First prize is \$4,000 and 50 eSmart digital licenses and a Digital Maker Party in a Box!! So please help us to win – it's much easier than a sausage sizzle at Bunnings!!!

On the subject of fundraising, thank you to everyone that supported the 'Country Colours' fundraiser by the Student Councillors last Friday. The students all looked very colourful!! We raised \$532. As was stated previously, our aim is to raise money to donate to Telethon. This is instead of raising money for 'Day for Daniel' or 'Cystic Fibrosis' because, as we know, the money raised for Telethon goes towards the various areas of research and support for children such as 'CF' and cancer. It also gives the councillors an opportunity to attend during the Telethon weekend and present the money on behalf of Mindarie Primary. We will advise our community of the total amount raised prior to the Telethon weekend.

This morning we had some very excited Year 5 and 6 boys who were heading off to compete in the 'Glory Cup' soccer competition. This competition is a yearly event and it is organised by School Sport WA. Students who participate in this event are therefore competing at a high level and they may later on be considered for inclusion in School Sport WA Interstate competitions. It was great to see the boys proudly wearing the new school sports shirts as they headed off to compete. Our thanks again go to the P&C for funding these shirts. At the last P&C meeting they agreed to finance a further 80 shirts so all teams will have shirts to wear. Thanks also go to the parents who have been helping Mr Burns train the teams.

The Yirra Yaakin Theatre Group visited Mindarie Primary School to enact the performance Kaarla Kaatijin (which in Noongar means to 'understand fire'). They used Noongar knowledge and storytelling to deliver traditional stories about fire in an exciting and engaging way.

The students followed the lives of Djitty Djitty (Willy Wagtail), Kulbardi (Magpie), Yonga (Kangaroo) as they explored the importance of Kaarla (Fire). Travelling through four different stories, our students learned about Meeka, Kaarla and Djitty Djitty the Brave, How the Magpie and Crow Got Their Colour and Songs and How We Made Fire.

Our students enjoyed learning about the traditional Noongar dreaming stories.

Walking on the Paths

This fortnight, we are encouraging students to walk on the paved areas around the school at all times to ensure their own and others' safety.

Learning Intention: We are being Safe and Respectful by walking quietly and safely around the school premises when transitioning from one place to another.

Rationale: We need to learn how to move around safely within school and the wider community in order to keep the people around us safe.

How can we show appropriate behavior at school?

Walking safely between buildings
Running on the senior area, oval and junior area.
Exceptions being under teacher discretion example:

Playing games outside with your teacher.
Speed walking
Skipping
Skipping
Sprinting
Jogging
Jogging

Students who are displaying green light behaviours will be able to earn a playground star to exchange for a stamp in their Positive Behaviour Book. Those students displaying red light behaviour will be sat out for five minutes and if they continue to display the behaviour, they will be sent to the reflection room to complete a reflection sheet.

Your support in encouraging the green light behaviour of walking on the paths, when dropping off your child in the mornings or collecting them in the afternoons, would be greatly appreciated. This also includes making sure all scooters and bikes are being walked through the school grounds to and from the bike racks.

While we have a focus area each fortnight, we are still encouraging and practising those skills previously learned. Please take the time to discuss these with your child and find out what some of the green light behaviours are for these expectations.



GIFTED AND TALENTED Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC)

ASSESSMENT OF YEAR 4 STUDENTS FOR THE PEAC PROGRAM

The PEAC Program provides part time extension and enrichment for exceptionally able students in Years 5 and 6. PEAC offers a range of courses that provide identified students with work that is intellectually challenging.

All students in Year 4 will have the opportunity to be assessed for suitability for the PEAC Program.

Testing at Mindarie Primary School will occur on 07/08/2018.

The scores from the test will be used in the selection of students for PEAC courses and extension programs during 2019 to 2020 and also to inform educational provision in schools.
