# Waterwise School Message from the Principal Salam (Greating) to 1

All who attended last week's assembly would have noted that our Year 3 students are now learning a Language Other Than English (LOTE). This is a requirement of the School Curriculum and Standards Authority and it applies to all schools in Western Australia. Mindarie Primary staff opted to teach Indonesian for several reasons. Indonesia is one of our closest neighbours, also many of our students have travelled to Indonesia and therefore have had some experience of the culture of Indonesia. In addition, when studying History and Geography our students look at the location of Australia's neighbouring countries and their diverse natural characteristics and human characteristics. Therefore, the focus on Indonesian as a language also allows for integrated studies. The Year 3 students from TA 28 and 29 definitely showed how quickly they can pick up a new language.

It is fantastic to see how well our Year 6 students are doing in their leadership roles. Mr Whitaker did comment on how impressed he is by the skills the Enviro Rangers are showing. They have definitely become skilled in the area of gardening. In addition, we have our photographers who are ensuring that special moments are captured at the assembly and also around the school.

The Faction Captains and Vice Captains are working hard with Mr Burns with their responsibility of handing out sports equipment at recess and lunch breaks. The Councillors have been very busy in their role. They are definitely showing a lot of leadership in this area. # Science News

During Science Club this week we have been learning how to make bubble mixture. We have been using a recipe with one cup of water, one tablespoon of sugar and two tablespoons of dishwashing soap. Both the sugar and the dishwashing soap allow the water molecules to become more "stretchy", because the bond of attraction between hydrogen and oxygen molecules is reduced. A "sugary" bubble will hold its shape for much longer on a flat surface. This creates the strength in the bubble wall which allows us to blow bubbles, inside bubbles, inside bubbles. Lots and lots of fun!

Follow Teacher Instructions This month, we are encouraging students to follow teacher instructions.

Learning Intention: We are being Safe and Respectful by following teacher instructions in order to create a positive environment that allows everyone to learn and play safely in all areas of the school.


Rationale: We need to learn how to follow instructions within school and the wider community in order to keep the people around us safe, show respect and become a responsible citizen.

How can we show appropriate behavior at school? Follow the traffic light system:

- Green yes that's it, you've got it!
- Orange almost, but not quite.
- Red these behaviours are unacceptable!
- Full attention to the speaker.
- Follow instructions in a timely
- manner.
  Seeking clarification in a polite
- manner.
- Whole Body Listening.
- Being able to repeat instructions when asked.
  - This is our Success Criteria!
- Trying to make others follow teacher instructions in a way that is distracting.

Some attention to the speaker.

- Following instructions but in your own time or wasting time.
- Follow part of the instructions.



- Interrupting the speaker.
- Being defiant/ doing the opposite.
- Arguing and answering back.
- Being disrespectful in your questioning.
- Distracting others.
- Encouraging others to disobey instructions.
- Moving before instructed to do so.

Students who are displaying green light behaviours will earn a stamp for their Positive Behaviour Chart in their diary. Your support in encouraging the green light behaviour of 'following instructions' would be greatly appreciated.

While we have a focus area each month, we are still encouraging and practising those skills previously learned. Please take the time to discuss these with your child and find out what some of the green light behaviours are for these expectations.
