Dear Parents and Caregivers

It is for this reason that the testing is conducted over two weeks. Whilst no form of testing is ever really 'normal' for students, we do endeavour to keep it as 'normal' as we possibly can.

It was fantastic to see the level of drive, commitment and 'grit' our students demonstrated whilst competing in the Faction Cross Country last Friday. The students really pushed themselves and were very proud of their achievements. Special thanks go to Mr Burns for the organisation. In addition, it was terrific to see the level of parental support provided to the students.

As we head towards the Semester 1 reporting period, it is timely to remind parents that taking students out of school during term time is an infringement of the Education Act. CODE OF CONDUCT

All staff working at Mindarie Primary are here because they care about children. At all times they will be acting in a manner that is in the best interest of all the children they are working with.

Mindarie Primary will request that any person who contravenes the Code of Conduct leaves the school grounds/premises.





Mindarie Primary School Kindergarten 2019

Is my child eligible for Kindergarten?

If your child was born between 1 July 2014 and 30 June 2015, then they are eligible to enrol for Kindergarten in 2019 at Mindarie Primary School.

How do I register my child?

Application to enrol forms are available from the front office or you can download a copy via the school website, school app or from Connect.

You must also provide:

- Birth certificate
- Immunisation Records (either Medicare or the Dept of Immunisation)

Enrol Now

- Proof of Address (a recent utility bill)
- Visa (if you are not an Australian citizen)
- Letter to Principal (out of area applications only)

Places are extremely limited, so please apply as soon as possible.

Finding books

Finding the right book for your child is essential to encourage their interest in reading. Your child may enjoy books about people and places that are just like them; or they may enjoy fantasy and mystery stories. Consider choosing books about your child's interests, where you live or your culture.

Give your child the opportunity to experience a range of different things to read including fiction, non-fiction, plays, poetry and short stories.

Children are born ready to learn and, right from birth, benefit greatly from being wrapped into a parent's warm embrace while sharing the sounds, language patterns and images of a storybook on a favourite topic. Even after children can read for themselves they continue to benefit from (and enjoy) sharing books with their parents. So never stop reading to the m

Never Stop Reading! encourages families to read aloud even when their children can read by themselves

Research shows that reading aloud improves children's knowledge and vocabulary, as well as their writing and comprehension. By listening to their children read aloud, families are supporting their children's learning, and increasing their confidence and sense of socurity.

Never STOP READING

If English is not your child's first language, it is valuable to encourage them to learn words and read in their first language.

Never STOP **READING!**

Building a love of reading

Reading is a skill that is learnt, and needs to be practised. As a parent, you can support your child by helping them read at home.

- Here are some great ideas for reading at home as a family.
- · Have a special place at home to keep books and other reading materials.
- Encourage your child to choose what they would like to read. Be positive about their choices.
- Let your child are you reading for enjoyment. and to learn.
- Share your reading choices with your child and tell them why you have chosen a particular book or article; what you are reading and what it is making you think about.
- Encourage your child to set aside a regular time to reading each day. Model this yourself so your child sees you as a reader.



- Be interested in what your child is reading, and ask them to recommend books for you to read. Visit the local library regularly so your child can
- browse the huge range of reading materials, and ask the Ebrarian for recommendations.

For parents of children aged 8 to 12 years old

- Encourage your child to find things to read about their favourite topics. Explore together different formats such as audio books and graphic novels.
- Try out books in a series. If your child gets 'hooked' by the first book, they are more likely to continue reading the series.
- Monitor access to a computer or device, either at home or in the local library so that your child can use the internet
- Buy books as gifts.
- Swep and share books with family and friends · Ask others about what they are reading.
- Support what is happening at school Your children will be reading lots of things at school. Here's how you can tap into what is happening at school
- Go to cleas meetings offered by the teacher so you know what the children are learning in different learning areas. Talk with the teacher individually about what you can do to help your child.
- Ask your child about the book they have taken out of the school library, for example "Why did you choose that book? and "Is it what you thought it was going to be?"
- Show an interest in work your child may do at home on projects or research.

Looking for work or a career change? Can you see yourself working in a school?

Schools are regularly hiring people for the following roles: Gardener, cleaner, administration, management, canteen or as education assistants.

Starting in July 2018, North Metropolitan TAFE are running a one semester course on the skills required to be a successful candidate for employment in a school. The course aids in preparation for entry into gardening, cleaning, administration, management, canteen and education assistant work.

We have had success supporting people to find work and the chances of gaining employment are strong. This course is suitable for existing gardeners, cleaners, administrators etc., and people looking to change career or people looking for work.

The course includes:

- Training in skills specific to the role you are interested in e.g. gardening, cleaning and IT skills
- · Work experience in a school or other organisation
- Help and support to find work
- Help accessing further training as required e.g. Certificate III in Education Support
- Development of your job application cover letter, resume and help with selection criteria

Entry requirements:

- Strong work ethic
- · Good oral and written communication
- · Must be able to read procedures, safety sheets and chemical bottles
- · Successful completion of an entry interview
- Working With Children Check and a Police Clearance

Course details:

- · 3 days per week Starts Wednesday 18th July finishes Friday 30th November (17 weeks)
- Days Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 9:15 until 2:45
- Cost \$205 (total course fee for full 17 weeks) based in Leederville and on site
